HOW TO EAT AN ICE CREAM CONE

Stan Frankenthaler, executive chef for Baskin-Robbins, has the scoop:

1. Don't tilt.
2. Start by licking from the top, not the bottom.
3. Lick evenly all over.
4. Every so often, lick in a circle where the ice cream meets the cone so it doesn't drip.
5. Remember to push down when licking on the top of the ice cream to squish it into the cone better.

SOFT VS. HARD INSIDER TIP

Since soft ice cream is served at a higher temperature (and thus has less ice in it), it will begin to melt faster than hard ice cream, says Doug Goff, Ph.D., of the University of Guelph, Ontario, Canada.
